Announcements

A note about our Order of Worship: Our order of worship and many of the pieces of our liturgy today are adapted from the Sunday morning worship of the Iona Community as found in the *Iona Abbey Worship Book*.

A note about the Carmina Gadelica: During the Highland Clearances and the years that followed, measures were taken by the English government to eradicate Highland culture. Speaking Gaelic and wearing tartans were prohibited. Clans were broken up. The old traditions were looked down upon. However, many Highlanders secretly kept the traditions of their past. In the 19th century, Alexander Carmichael, a man who worked for the civil government in Customs and Excise, collected the prayers, incantations, stories, practices, and traditions of the Highlanders in their native tongue of Gaelic and published them in the *Carmina Gadelica: Hymns and Incantations*. The book preserved Scottish Highland culture for future generations.
